9:30 a.m. Arrive at McDonald's Greenhouse Corn Maze

Welcome by Old McDonald. He will explain the layout of the farm and the activities that follow

9:45 a.m. Split into groups of 20-25

(The haywagon can fit about 20-25 people depending on the size of the children or if children sit on parent's laps)

Start a rotation of several activities. Each activity takes about 15-20 minutes.

- 1. GAGA BALL PIT** Have a healthy, heart-pumping game of dodge ball in the Gaga Ball Pit.
- 2. PEDAL TRACTOR** Enjoy a ride around the track on a pedal tractor – on the tractor color of your choice!
- 3. HAY WAGON RIDE** Driver will talk about crops and beef cattle and answer any questions about the farm.
- 4. CORN MAZE** Enter and defeat the five acre Corn Maze.
- 5. YARD GAMES** Free play on the giant slides, giant sandbox and corn box.
- 6. PETTING ZOO** Pet baby bunnies, pigs, lambs, goats, and other animals. If a grown-up watches the gate, you are welcome to enter into the pen and get a close-up feel.
- 7. EDUCATIONAL** Such activities, based on your group's age, as tasting apple cider, milking Maggie the fiberglass Holstein, reading an autumn-themed book and looking at agricultural displays.
- 8. PICK YOUR OWN PUMPKIN** Go out into the field and select your own pumpkin. Hope you gives kids a change to bounce off their energy like a kangaroo!
- 9. ENCHANTED FOREST** Take a stroll down to the Enchanted Forest to identify trees, explore the Indian tee-pee, and listen to the quiet.
- 10. KANGAROO JUMPER** Kids and parents will love this new, big, colorful attraction that
